A MESSAGE FROM RAE-ANN, HAILEY'S MOTHER

When we discovered Zajac Ranch we were filled with an overpowering sense of relief.

After taking a tour of the Ranch, our family was so excited; we finally found a camp that understood Hailey's physical needs and allowed her to be part of all the camp activities while keeping her safe. After the tour, Hailey declared that she wanted to go to camp for a whole week. This statement coming from a child who had never spent a night away from family, and who also didn't want anything to do with being at any summer camp before taking a tour of Zajac Ranch.

The 2010 camp season will be Hailey's fourth year at Zajac Ranch. It is her 'special place' where she gets to try all of the activities, and relishes the fact that being hoisted up on the high-ropes makes me a little queasy but gives Hailey such a thrill! The Zajac Ranch has allowed Hailey to be herself, and is a place where her disability isn't anything out of the ordinary. But most of all, for me, her utmost safety is always ensured, and she is never left on the 'side-lines'.

Our new 11,200 sq.ft. Indoor/Outdoor Therapeutic Pool and Spa complex is fully wheelchair accessible and is designed to ensure that children with mobility issues can participate in our water activities. The complex is designed with a mining theme that includes a "wheelchair track" around the pool that leads you through a tunnel and waterfall and has changing rooms designed like mine shafts.

The building includes a therapeutic spa funded by the **Abercrombie Foundation**, the **Hugh W. Ingraham** physiotherapy room, a wellness/exercise facility in honour of **Greg Moore** and a still to be named general store where children can choose their favourite souvenir in memory of their camp experience at the Zajac Ranch for Children!

At the Zajac Ranch for Children our mission is to raise the spirits of children with serious and chronic illnesses and disabilities by providing the joy of summer camp.

At the Zajac Ranch, campers can experience the often unique sensation of not being "different". They can interact with other children who truly understand what they are going through, forging lasting friendships. They can increase their confidence, independence and self-esteem, and accomplish things they never dreamed were possible. The lives of special needs children often revolve around what they can't do; at the Zajac Ranch, we focus on what they can do, turning tears and fears into laughter and smiles.

The Zajac Ranch for Children has removed many barriers that existed between children with special medical needs and the magic of summer camp: we have created a safe and supportive environment of caring staff and volunteers, state-of-the-art medical equipment, and fully accessible facilities. However, financial barriers still exist. All campers receive half the cost of sending them to camp and some as much as 100%. Our goal is to have all campers come to camp free of charge. With such specialized training and personalized programming and equipment costs, as well as the need for a smaller than average camper-to-counselor ratio, the cost of a week at the Zajac Ranch is still beyond the means of many

families. It is our goal to ensure that all children with special medical needs can attend our summer camps regardless of their financial circumstances.

All children, regardless of their medical needs, deserve the opportunity to experience summer camp. We cannot do this alone. We require the continuing support of the community to ensure that as many of these special children as possible are offered this opportunity.

Leaving a financial legacy or planned gift helps to create sustainable financial support for the Zajac Ranch for Children. It is a means of making a gift that maximizes the tax and estate planning benefits to the donor. It is also a reflective process that takes time, careful thought and above all, provides meaningful outcomes.

Legacy giving does not need to affect current financial circumstances and often involves the use of wills, life insurance policies, endowments and trusts. Legacy giving can also include immediate gifts of cash, property, listed securities and other types of assets.
